### Volunteer Support:

**Tutors:** Assist students in various subjects including math, reading/language arts and science. Tutors are matched based on skill level, grade preference and are scheduled according to their availability.

**Chapel Guest Speakers (On-going):** Scheduled dates throughout the school year.

**Read Across America Day (March):** Volunteer to read a book of your choice to a classroom in K4 – 4<sup>th</sup> Grades.

**Living History Museum (Feb) and Science Fair Judges (March):** Events are held in the spring semester each school year.

**End of Year Test Proctors (April):** Help with annual testing week in mid-April.

### In-Kind:

**School Supplies:** white copy paper, color construction paper, wide-rule notebooks, pencils, glue sticks, folders, 1 inch 3-ring binders, flash drives, hand sanitizers, disinfectant wipes, facial tissues.

**Current Wish List Items:** Playground mulch, Podium for School Programs, Computer Speakers, New Carpet in Administrative Offices, New Paint Job for Middle School Building.

**Services:** construction and repair assistance for buildings, lawn service, painting, vehicle maintenance, repair and bi-monthly detailing services, and more.

**Residential Program supplies:** paper towels, toilet paper, liquid dish detergent, HE laundry detergent, dryer sheets, disinfectant wipes, bathroom and kitchen cleaning supplies, toothpaste, toothbrushes, bar soap, hand soap, hand sanitizer, men's and women's deodorant.

**Individual packaged snacks:** animal crackers, chips, fruit snacks, 100% juice boxes, cookies, granola bars and pop tarts and cereal bars.

## Financial:

As a private, Christian school we rely on donations from individuals, church partners, foundations and business to support over 95% of our operating budget. Tuition and fees do not cover the cost to educate our students. Your support is greatly appreciated. Donations of any size are welcome and are beneficial to our school. Below are examples of the funding needed to help cover the educational costs for students at BCA.

\$1,000 – Funds Lower School Instruction for One Day

\$3,000 – Funds Special Activities and Supplies for all 30 Residential Students

\$5,000 – Funds one Residential Scholarship for one Student

\$7,000 – Funds a Day School Scholarship for one Student

\$12,000 – Funds a Full Scholarship for one Student (Day School and Residential Program)
