Binghampton Christian Academy (BCA) participates in the **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)** through the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program.

Under CEP, **all enrolled students at Binghampton Christian Academy are eligible to receive school breakfast and lunch at no charge**, subject to the requirements of the school's approved meal programs and applicable USDA and Tennessee Department of Education requirements.

BCA uses **Memphis-Shelby County Schools Nutrition Services** to provide school meals to BCA students.

Because BCA participates in CEP:

- Families are **not required to submit individual household meal applications** for students to receive meals at no charge.
- All enrolled students have access to school breakfast and lunch through the school's approved meal programs.
- Students will not be identified, singled out, or stigmatized based on participation in the school meal program.
- BCA will protect the privacy and dignity of students receiving school meals.
- Families will be provided information about meal availability and program procedures as required by USDA and the Tennessee Department of Education.
- BCA will maintain required CEP and school nutrition program records.

Questions About the Food Program

For questions regarding school meals, meal service, menus, dietary accommodations, food allergies, or other food-program matters, families may contact the Binghampton Christian Academy school office or the school's designated school nutrition contact.

NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

In accordance with federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, Binghampton Christian Academy, its employees, and institutions participating in USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating on the basis of **race, color, national origin, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), disability, age, or**

The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
